We Build Capacity

The Library provides the SFU research and student community with access to collections, digital research tools, and expertise that enable the discovery and creation of new knowledge. We empower researchers by making it easy to access, use, analyze, and share information. We work "from discovery to knowledge mobilization," as described in SFU's Strategic Research Plan.

We will:

- Equip students to be adept users of information, preparing them as graduates, citizens, and lifelong learners
- Integrate research and academic skills instruction at the course, program, and departmental level at the most meaningful points in student learning
- Facilitate development of the digital research skills of faculty members
- Build responsive and enduring collections, including distinctive and accessible Special Collections
- Create interdisciplinary, community-building spaces

We Enhance the Student Experience

The Library serves as primary academic space outside the classroom. Here our unique and diverse students connect with knowledge, with the University, and with each other. The Library will work with campus partners to transform the student experience by contributing to the academic success and wellness of students as part of SFU's vision for a Healthy Campus Community.

We will:

- Prioritize student needs by more actively seeking feedback
- Deepen our commitment to student research
- Offer employment, mentorship, and training opportunities to students to enhance student engagement and employability
