### Research prompts

#### 1. Group presentations

Working in groups of 4, you will research a dance tradition or form of your choosing. You will discuss when it began, why it emerged, the social/art context of the time and how this informed it, the aesthetic / movement elements, how it evolved, seminal teachers/artists/works, etc.

It will be 10 minutes in length and alongside your oral presentation you will incorporate power-point, and a small live physical demonstration. Each member of the group will also write their own 300-word summary of the research process to hand in on the day of the presentation.

The presentation gives you the opportunity to bring in a dance history that is not covered in class.

Some possible topics: social dance (global, local, etc.), folk dance (global, local, etc.), dance in/on social media, martial arts, sport, circus, musicals, break-dancing, K-Pop, ...and so many more."

#### 2. Research Paper (1000-1250 words + works cited)

Topic choice based on prompts, develop a hypothesis and argument, drawing on a dance artist/s and their artwork/s, and 3 sources (additional to artwork/s).





Dance history resources include both primary materials that provide a direct experience with artistic production (performance, autobiographies, dance notation, reviews, choreography notes) and secondary materials that provide an interpretation or synthesis of these materials, such as writings of researchers and scholars, including opinions and points of view, in-depth discussions, histories and critical overviews.

#### Background

Start with these sources if you have a broad topic and want to discover the range of sub-topics you might address. Use these encyclopedias or dictionaries to find definitions of terms, biographical information, overviews of dance history, and information on all forms of dance and people involved with dance.


Many include a list of recommended readings or a bibliography of related sources that the author has consulted. Scan these for other relevant research. Use the Library Search to see if SFU has a copy of the book or journal article cited.


#### International encyclopedia of dance

Nearly 2,000 articles on all aspects of dance, including theatrical, ritual, dance-drama, folk, traditional, ethnic, and social dance. Cultural and national overviews are accompanied by entries on dance forms, music and costumes, performances, and biographies of dancers and choreographers.

### Search tools

- Overviews of topics in specialized encyclopedias, with lists of further reading
- Library catalogue search to find
  - Critical, in-depth discussions in books, articles, book chapters
  - Biographies of dancers, choreographers, companies
  - Histories of dance practice
- Article databases to find
  - Shorter, more focused discussions in articles and book chapters
  - Performance review articles in newspapers, performance magazines
  - Library video collection, streaming video databases

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#### General notes on MLA style

Writers, scholars and students all incorporate, confirm, modify, correct, and refute the work done by previous scholars and peers. The Modern Language Association (MLA) style is a system of documentation that directs readers to the source of the quotation, paraphrased idea, fact, or other material that has been borrowed from someone else (95).

#### P Key points

#### Why do you need to cite?

There are two key reasons to cite your sources:

- To identify other people's ideas and information used within your paper.
  - the use of proper citations gives writers a verifiable way to refer to someone else's work

#### Where do you cite?

Citations must appear in two parts of your document:

- 1. In the body of your paper ("in-text" or "parenthetical" citations)
- 2. Listed on the Works Cited page (at the end of your paper)
