Policy Commons is a public policy **database** launched in November 2020. It contains documents from think tanks, IGOs, NGOs, and research centers. Some of this content is uniquely found on Policy Commons, and some documents are archived from inactive organizations.

- Millions of documents
- Publications organized by topics
- Tables and figures searchable
- Directory of organizations

Why might it be useful in your research?

- Provides a convenient place to search for public policy **grey literature***, which is otherwise often spread across the internet
- Preserves content from defunct organizations, or documents that have been removed from the internet
- Grey literature can provide a different perspective from academic literature

*Grey literature "is information produced outside of traditional publishing and distribution channels, and can include reports, policy literature, working papers, newsletters, government documents, speeches, white papers, urban plans, and so on."

Access

You do not need to create a new account on the Policy Commons website in order to access the search and documents within. However, creating an account with Policy Commons does allow you to make use of additional features, such as creating lists and following organizations.

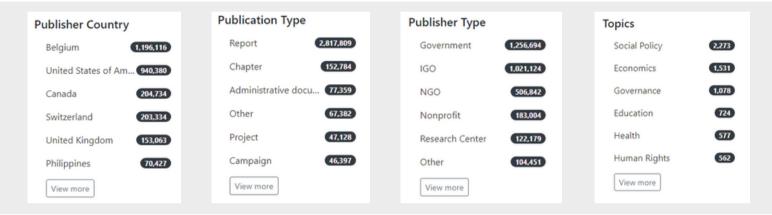
Using Policy Commons



Policy Commons contains documents that are **almost all** possible to find elsewhere online if you are a dedicated searcher.

However, Policy Commons offers several **key features** that a Google search alone does not provide.

 Powerful search filters that allow you to create precise, focused searches and limit your results to manageable numbers

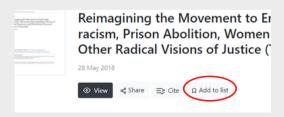


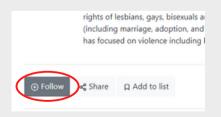
- A growing collection of curated topics and lists
- Conduct a targeted **search for tables** deep within reports





- Find **organizations** (NGOs, IGOs, etc.) that are doing work in your area of interest
- Ability to **personalize** the resource to fit your research needs:
 - Create your own lists
 - Follow organizations
 - Upload your own digital content







- Search for the content you want without ads or sorting through other irrelevant content
- A consistent place to find reports that have or might otherwise disappear from organization websites without warning
