

# Objectives of BC Parks iNaturalist Project:


- Improving inventory of > 1000 provincial parks

Thousands of hikers and other visitors are uploading photos to iNaturalist. Far more data than professional biologists can collect. Free app, fun to use.


### **Improving Inventories**

#### May 2019 - before our first field season




### **Improving Inventories**







Invasive species are a huge concern for conservation. iNaturalist's database knows which species are non-native in which area; just a few clicks to generate these maps.






### **Threatened Species in BC Parks**



### We found this record in iNaturalist





I organized a search in areas north of Mission, BC, based on the record in iNatralist and other records. We found it! Including a site where it hadn't been seen for 40 years. Here we are photographing one in the photo on the right. That was a new site for Canada







Now, there are 67 records of this rare insect in iNaturalist, as other people searched for it after seeing or records in iNaturalist.
